Hello Everyone,

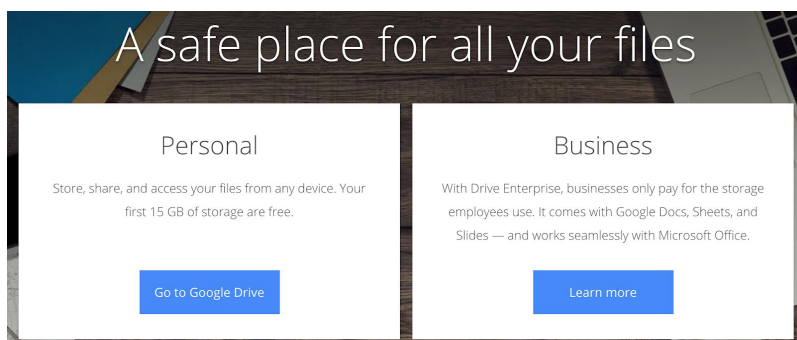

Step One: Sign into Google Account

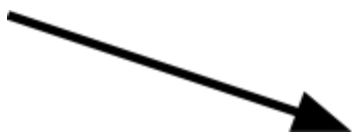
For all students in kindergarten through second grade, I sent out email and password information for Google shortly after the school closure started. Please check for a ClassDojo message from me for this information.



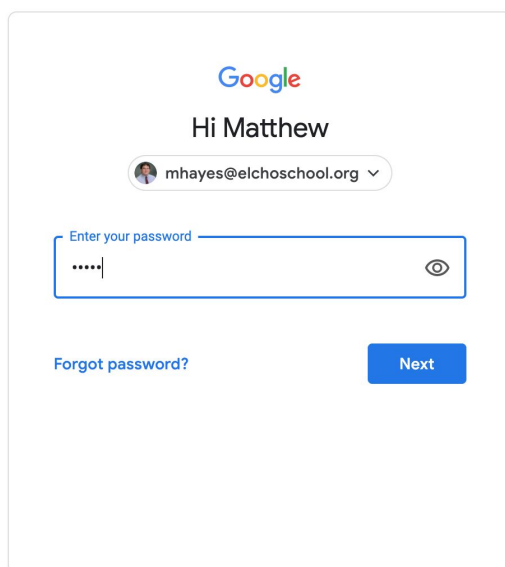
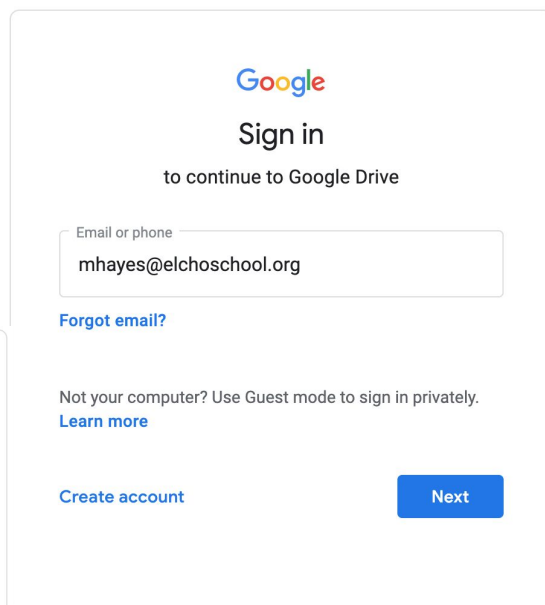
Go to google.com/drive on the internet.

Click on the blue button “Go to Google Drive.”

Type in your email.



Then type in your password. You can click on the eye to see the password as you are typing it into the box.

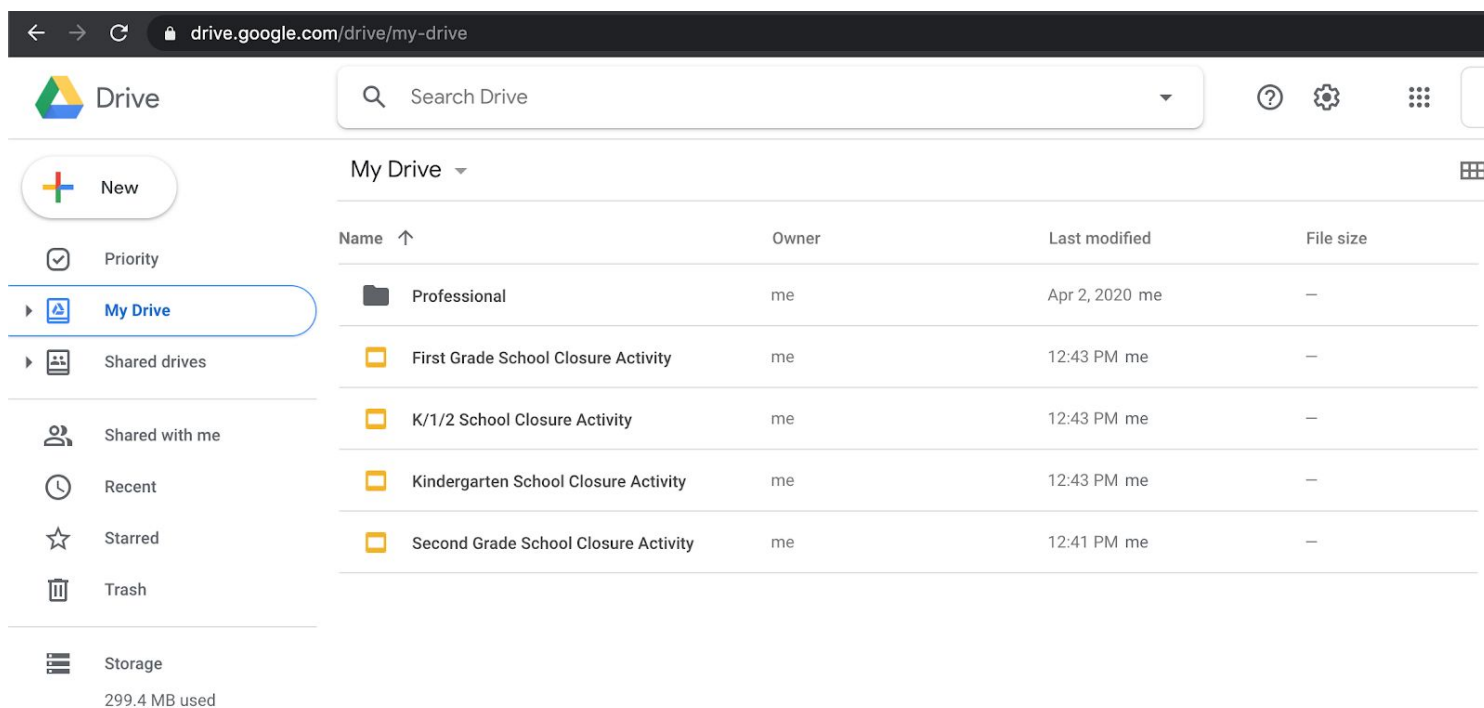
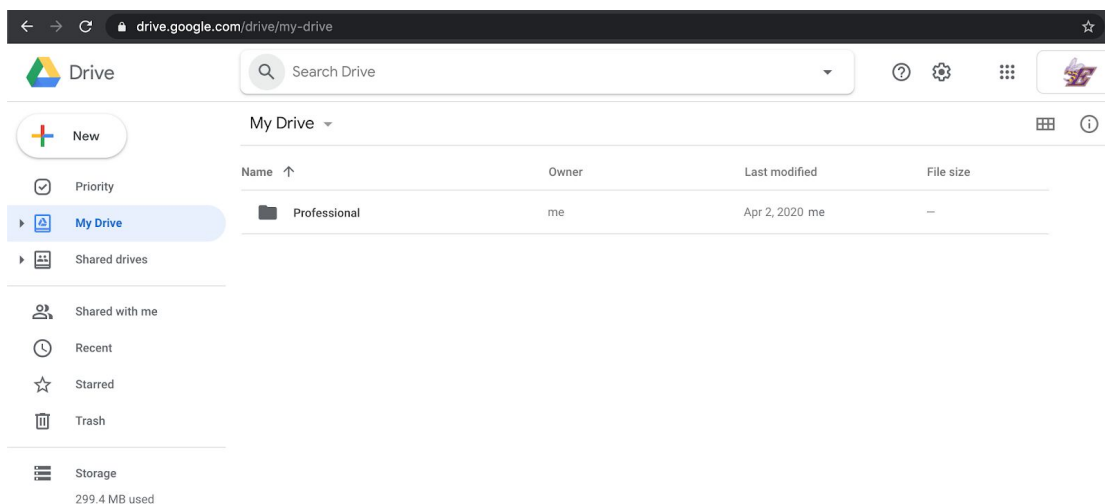

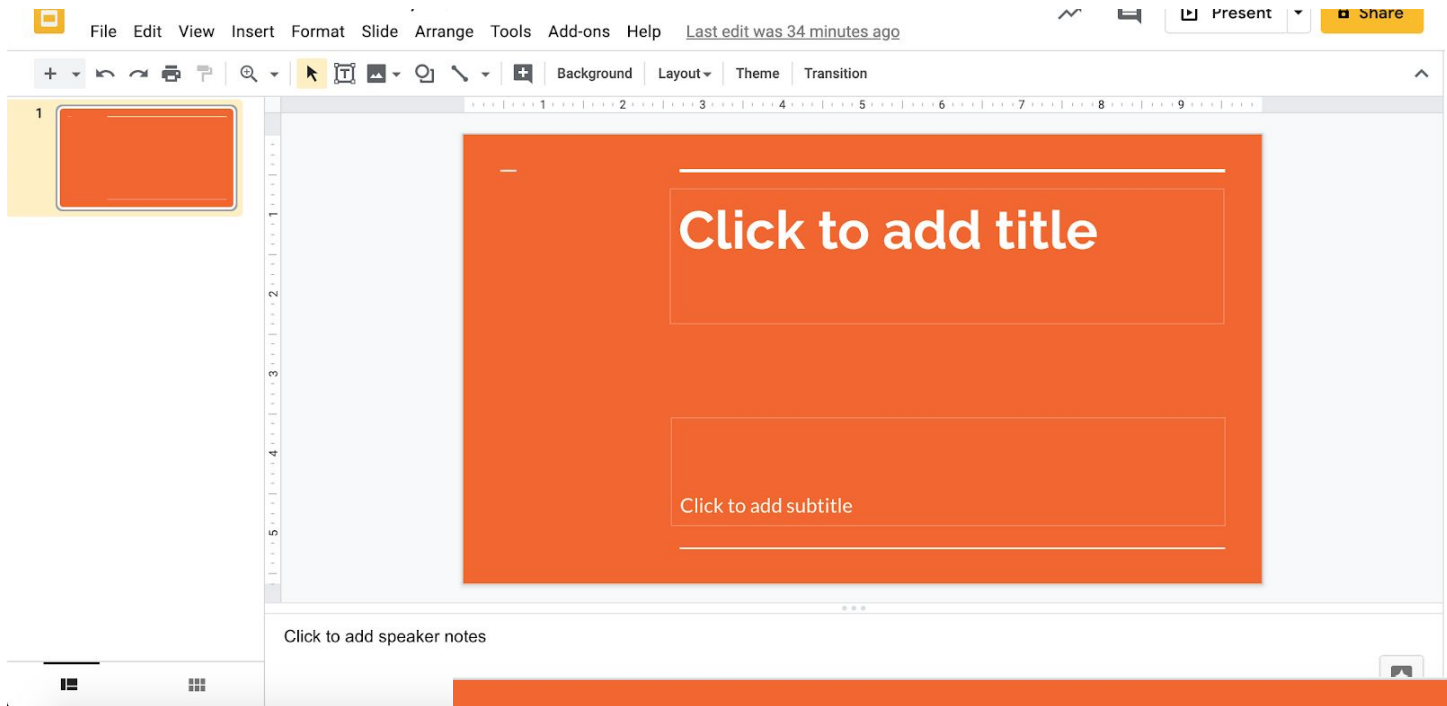

First, click on the plus in the upper left corner. Otherwise, you will be changing other students' work. This will open a new slide for you to add information.

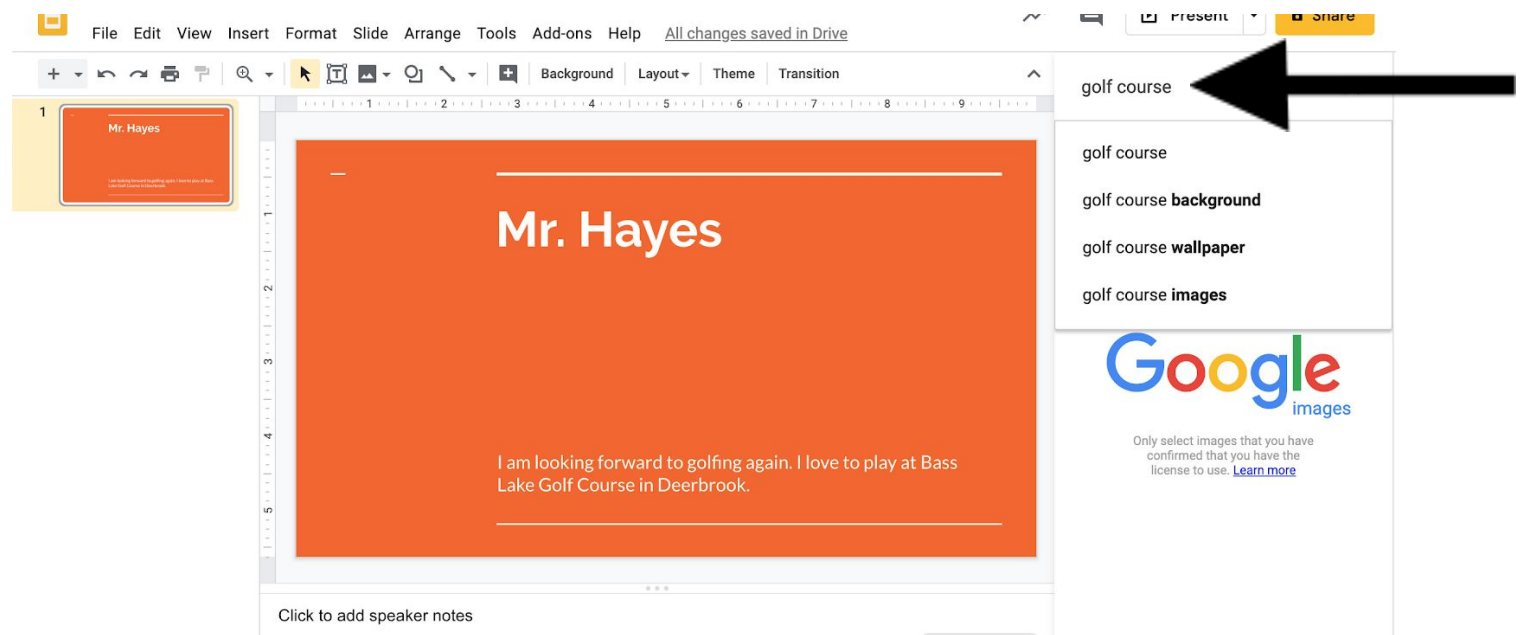
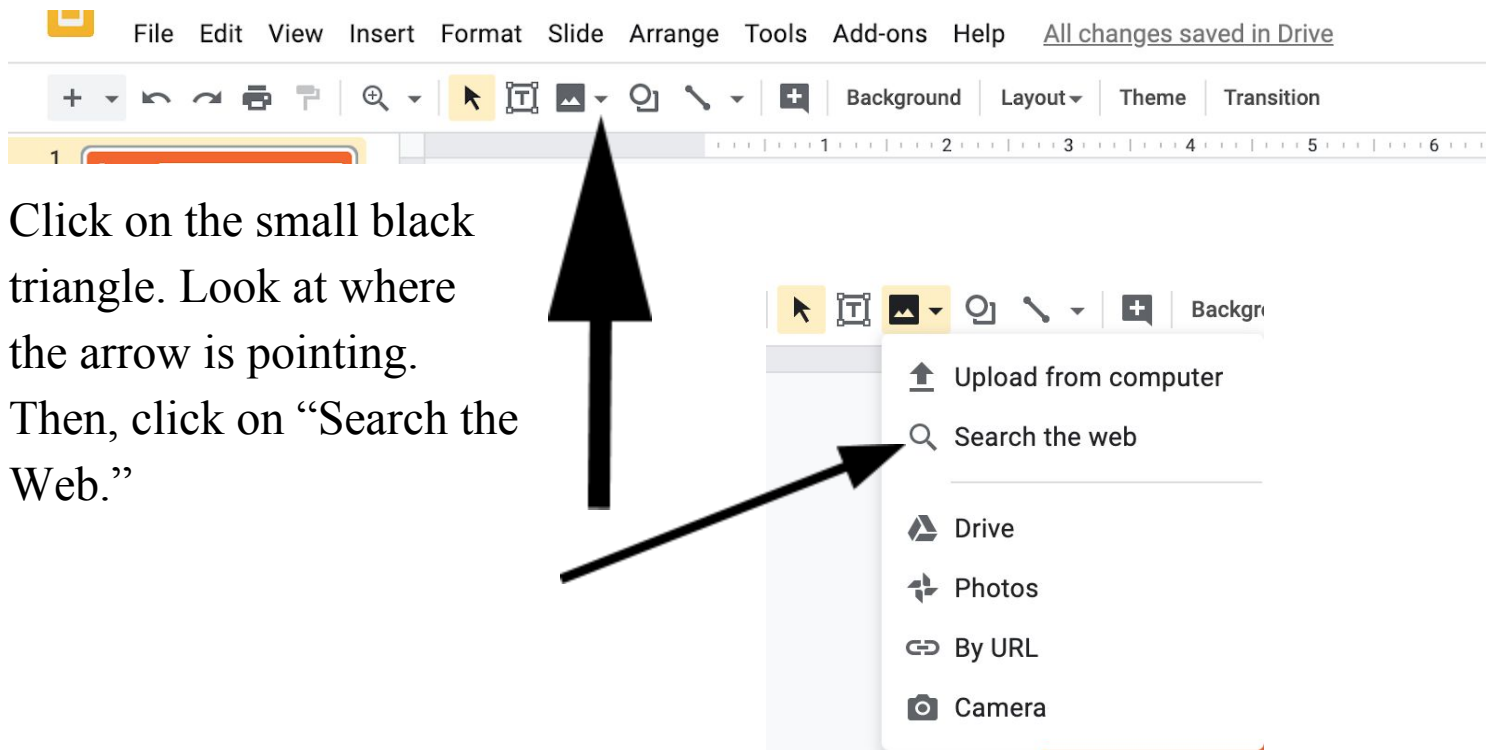


Click on “Click to add title” and write your name. Then click on “Click to add subtitle.” In this box, I want you to write something you are looking forward to after the

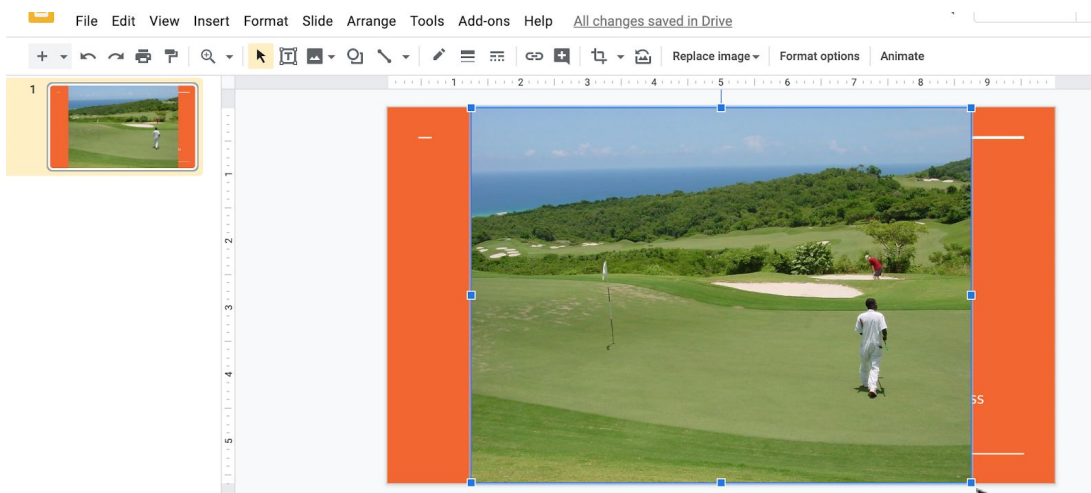

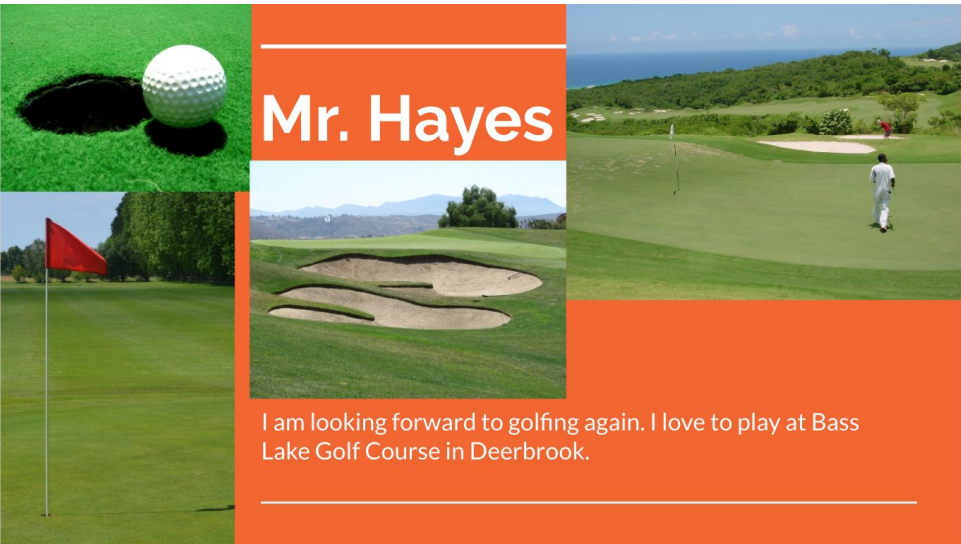
