



Remote Learning Expectations

- Students are expected to log in to Google Meets created by their teachers for each scheduled hour of the day (with the exception of a scheduled study hall).
 - If a teacher provides an activity alternative to the Google Meet it should be completed during the scheduled time for that class.
- Attendance is required and documented, including arriving tardy to a Google Meet or leaving before the end of the scheduled period (if the teacher is still teaching).
- All work assigned during a remote learning period will be required and graded. This may impact co-curricular eligibility.
 - Grade checks will continue as scheduled.
- The 6-12 Student Handbook still applies.
 - Students should be wearing school-appropriate attire during their meetings or they will be forced to leave the meeting. This will be marked as an unexcused absence.
 - Appropriate language and behavior is expected, both verbally and in writing.
 - Students should follow the Honor Code for academic honesty in all of their remote learning activities.
 - The district is using software to monitor student technology use to prevent cheating.
- Students not meeting expectations or those that misuse their devices may lose technology privileges and will be given paper/pencil replacement assignments.
- If a teacher requests a one-on-one Google Meet on a Friday to provide assistance, discuss expectations, etc. the student is expected to attend.
- If a teacher schedules a quiz or exam on a Friday to give students sufficient time to complete it the student is expected to attend.
- Any student without access to the internet will be provided with other avenues to complete their work, such as paper/pencil activities or a list of locations in the area with internet access.
